<u>Q&A</u>

Q. What finishes are safe for projects made for children?

A. Once cured, all finishes are safe, use something with no heavy metals. Other recommendations included salad bowl finish and mineral oil.

Q. How should you glue treated pine?

A. Use marine epoxy, poly glue along with hidden dowels for added strength.

Q. Will treated wood harm plants?

A. No but using cedar or redwood is a better choice.

Q. What is the best way to remove dust from a bandsaw?

A. Along with using a dust collection system, hook up a 4" port to a shop vac and attach to the up feed of the bandsaw blade.

Dick Koch brought in some samples of dove tail drawers.

Tom brought in some new rocking horse handles he made using copper banding on the end closest to the horse's head.

Quick and Easy Turned Toys by John Horn

Since one of my activities is playing Santa Claus each year, and woodturning is a major part of my life now that I have retired, it seems only natural that making toys and improving woodturning technique at the same time would be a desirable goal.

There is a lot of information available about making "flat" toys but little about "turned" toys. The few books that feature turned toys show rather complex ones that take a lot of time to complete. Since some woodworking groups are interested in producing a volume of toys for underprivileged children, several people in the Woodturners of North Texas have come up with designs and techniques for producing turned toys quickly that can be turned on any size of lathe. One of the items is toy cars, which offers an opportunity to develop and refine your skills with interrupted cuts while producing a worthwhile project for the community. What better way to develop proficiency is there other than a lot of practice using materials that are cheap and easy to turn?



John joined the Woodturners of North Texas in 1990 and actually started turning in 1996.

Since then he has demonstrated at the Texas Turn or Two, now called the South West Association of Turners for the last ten years and performed demonstrations for several clubs in Texas and Oklahoma. He has won several awards including 1st place at the State Fair of Texas in 1999 and 2000. His primary focus at this time is teaching classes for the beginning turner at the Woodcraft stores in Dallas (Addison) and in his shop in North Richland Hills. He has developed a series of projects, which the beginner can produce in a few hours, and get a flying start at successful woodturning.
