He says he followed the first sample 'recipe' called the Fayetteville but instead of the Dark Vintage Maple TransTint stain he used the Honey Amber TransTint for a warmer look. Gene Baugh made this jewelry box using mahogany. Joinery included finger joints on the drawers and mortise and tenons on the box. The finish is Danish oil.




Nello Armstrong turned these two nice looking mallets.

with Danish Oil. Ron got a 2<sup>nd</sup> place ribbon at the Texas State Fair in the Creative Class. Way to go Ron!





*Meetings focus on improving carving techniques through hands on projects. See our website for more information:*


