**Charles Garrison** showed a box he had made from a tree that a neighbor in North Carolina had cut down. Charles has made 20 bowls and 9 jewelry boxes from the wood (ambrosia maple). The box has a floating top and the interior tray is flocked.

Adam Yavner showed a canopied doll bed that he made from a design done by his young daughter.

**Laurence Briggs** had a picture of a cradle he made for his granddaughter. He also showed a turning he had done and finished using dye. He had several different colors of analyne dye.

**Dan Henry** had a picture of an oak entertainment center that he had built.

**Fred Groves** showed a birdhouse he had turned out of a dogwood that blew down in his neighbor's yard. Fred put the piece in the freezer for 3 weeks, then in the fridge. It developed a small crack, so he put it in a plastic bag on a shelf and later found that the crack had healed itself.

**Scott McCaffrey** showed some bandsaw boxes he had made from ash and afzelia burl.

**Bob Jones** showed his seven stitches from an accident with his bandsaw AND tablesaw. A door slammed, he jumped, and oops! This month's program was Band Saw Boxes, presented by Jill Baker. Mrs. Baker showed many of the beautiful boxes she has made, some of which have won ribbons at the State Fair. After giving a brief background for her interest in woodworking, Mrs. Baker explained how she designed and built each of the boxes. She had several different types of designs and many varieties of wood, most of which started out as purchased turning blocks. She showed an example of an error caused by bad blade alignment, a fence designed for small cuts, and some delightful wooden purses made on a Legacy Wood Chuck. Some suggested tips were: use nail files from beauty supply shops for tight corners, use 400 – 600 grit sandpaper, yellow wood glue, and last, but not least, a book entitled Building Beautiful Boxes by Lois Keener Ventura. Many thanks to Mrs. Baker for an excellent presentation.
