Program

The program was presented by **Vic Caranna** and was on the various types of joinery.

Vic first showed the use of hand tools in the process of making tenons and shoulders. He used a hand-marking gauge. Vic gave lots of hints to get it right the first time. He said there is pleasure in doing it by hand, but it is a slow process. shrinkage are often symptoms of tension wood.

Vic then showed the process of dowel joinery. He uses a 3/8" dowel and drill bit with a Sears gauge and a pointing center.

For biscuit joinery Vic uses a Porter-Cable. He likes it because he can use it on oblique angles and it can use the smallest biscuits. He uses the Craig system for pocket holes.




