Show and Tell

Dan Henry showed a jig he made to help him hang cabinet doors, a plywood carrier he made to hold large sheets, and a dust collection system w/out motor that he was planning to give away. The system quickly achieved auction status and was won by Dave Tyvner for \$27.

Fred Groves showed a plane he bought at a garage sale for \$5. It was a Stanley #9 made in 1819 and in excellent condition could be worth as much as \$1800. Some people have all the luck.

Walt Schuster showed some dowel screws and demoed how to use them. He got them from Wilson Plywood and Door. They sell stair parts.

Darrell Lawrence showed a cherry and walnut cradle he had made. He used walnut dowels to connect the legs together.

Orion Adcock showed two tables he made in miniature as prototypes using a new CAD program to design it. He now plans to sell his drafting table. He also showed a mahogany lap desk modeled after one used by Thomas Jefferson. His first attempt, using the pattern provided, warped badly, so it was necessary to alter the design slightly.

Unibit. He described how hard it is to cut a perfectly round hole in sheet metal. The bit can be bought at most electrical supply houses and Home Depot and uses regular household cooking oil to lubricate the bit as you drill.

Kirk Darroch showed a small bat he turned on his lathe.

Larry Maughn showed the magnetic clip he made for his nametag, offered some conversion charts he'd gotten from Master Gauge, and told of his composting equipment.

Dick Koch showed a marking gauge he made out of mahogany.


