Show and Tell

Gary Turman showed his new DeWalt impact driver that had almost no torque. It came with a hammer drill – both 14V and two batteries on special at Home Depot for \$259.

Steve Yauch also had some new tools to show. His old Craftsman drill had a bad battery so he bought a Hitachi combo for \$189. It contained a circular saw, reciprocating saw, drill, and a flashlight.

Dale Osborne asked about the batteries on the newer models. Do they need to be completely discharged before recharging? One helpful hint was to plug all of the chargers into one power strip and plug the power strip into a light timer. Have the timer come on 30 minutes a day to keep the batteries fully charged.

Dan Henry showed a new router fence he had made.

G.W. Robinson showed a quarter display case he made from a pattern in Wood magazine. The display was cut in the shape of the USA and comes apart to put in the new quarters as soon as they come from the mint.

Dan Dain brought in a solar powered floodlight he received in return for a product test in which he had been a participant.

Munawar Soomro had some pictures that **Bob Jones** had asked him to display.

Dale Osborne had some samples of New Zealand wood that he had gotten on his recent trip. One was the wood the Maori used to make canoes. He also had a doorstop from Tasmania and some woodcraft articles.

Dan Pugliese showed one of his beautifully made toys. This one was a helicopter with blades that turned

when it was pulled. The toy was a gift for a new nephew.

Roy Doell, having recently returned from a church mission trip, showed the stools and scroll work that the group built while on the trip.

Dan Dain and **Dan Pugliese** won the **Show and Tell** prizes - a picture of President Hamilton or two pictures of President Lincoln.

Program

Phil Timmons presented an informative and interesting show about scroll sawing. Some of the examples and hints were:

- A train scrolled from scrap wood
- A stacked antique car use double-sided tape when scrolling multiple copies (a small amount will suffice)
- Use adhesive spray to put the pattern on the wood, a #5 blade with 11.5 – 12.5 teeth per inch for tight turning
- To prevent tear out on the back use spray glue on a thin piece of cardboard attached to the back of the piece.
- Sand any tear outs before scrolling for example, drill holes to slide the blade through often leave tear outs.
- Test the level of your scroll table. They can be slightly off.
- Use scraps of anything you have laying around – molding, Corian, laminates, etc.


