Q: Wants to make an inexpensive workbench, does anyone have one of the big maple hardwood benches and if so, what makes it better than using plywood?

A: The heaviness is for stability in hand work.

A: To make the bench light and mobile but still sturdy, sandbag the legs.

A: Make a torsion box, they are light but very sturdy and stay flat.

A: Glue 2x4s together (faced), heavy and won't warp or sag.

Show and Tell

Bill Jacobs – Brought a band saw box he made for his granddaughter. It is made of walnut and maple. He also flocked the insides of the drawers and used magnets on the inside, back of the drawers to hold them in place. He Finished it with shellac.

Thad Burnett – Brought two hand made router planes, one of mesquite and one of walnut. He used a hex key sharpened for the blade. He also brought a bandsaw box of Ash with flocking on the inside.

John Bowen – Brought an antique hand plane he found at a sale in Comfort Texas. He also brought a game box that contains dominos, dice, cribbage pegs and cribbage board using a template from template.

John Loftis – Made 8 cutting boards he made for Christmas gifts to family. He put a Texas inlay in the center of each one. Made of Hard Maple and Walnut.

Wendall Brough – Brought a picture of his father-inlaw standing in front of The Eagles Nest as well as a plate carved in relief that was exchanged by the original crafter for 5 loaves of bread.

Dan Pugliese – Brought pictures of a blanket chest made of #1 pine with walnut trim and lined with aromatic cedar.

The **January** demo was given by Fred Hodges on Wood Jewelry Design and Completion.

Fred showed us how he makes jewelry out of all kinds of things; flowers, leaves, seeds, wood. Color, pattern and texture are necessary for jewelry making. You can slice a walnut into 4 slices, remove the nut and fill the shell with resin. You can use pieces of petrified wood. Cut seeds in half and polish them. Flower petals preserved in crystal. Use the lacework part of a prickly pear.




