Program

Program: Veneering with Michael Hench of CTS Wood Design

Michael started part-time in 2005 making small items then left IT to design wood full time. Eventually he found his way into veneer. His mentor was David Marks.

Using Veneer requires a good substrate. At first he used Wood Veneer Gallery to do his pressing.

Veneer can be wood, or cloth, or plastics. Use super glue with a clear coat finish for cloth.

94 ET Spray Adhesive is one of the best contact cements; it is a green product that is solvent based.

Pricing for Veneer work: \$5/ft² to purchase \$10/ft² to press \$20/ft² sale price/billed

Imports are very thin.

Parchment/Faux parchment is thin goat skin. \$120/ft²

Veneer can be applied to acrylic tubes for lighting. The light shines through the veneer showing off the wood grain; must use a low wattage bulb like a CFL.
