Larry Maughan turned this natural edged goblet and bowl out of maple and finished them using Mayland wipe-on finish.




Dan Nilius made this trestle table using red oak and mahogany for the top and walnut for the pedestal.





Chapter 9: The Finish

- On the Top Desk Surface:
 - Boiled Linseed Oil, then Garnett Shellac (2 coats), then Renaissance Wax (3 coats)
 - Note: Not Done (Yet)
- · Everywhere else:
 - Swedepaint's Mix of Linseed Oil and Beeswax (2 coats)
 - Done on All Surfaces Except Underside of Top (Yet)

Statistics

- ~600 Hours of Work
- 42" Tall x 36-40" Wide x 7'10" Long
- · Weight
 - 2 x 60lb Legs
 - 1 x 30lb Privacy Panel
 - 1 x 200lb Top with Drawers
 - = 350lb Total Weight
