Show & Tell



Ed Mastin made this AI Stirt inspired bowl. The "cosmic" effect comes from metal leaf added to the bowl inside. He used close grained as maple and the back or bottom side is rippled on the flat winged portion and textured on the bowl. The bottom is finished with oil; the top wings with sanding sealer; the metal leaf has acrylic sealer; then several coats of lacquer over the entire top.



Gary Turman showed off this 8" chef knife with a native Texas walnut handle and a 1/2" gouge. Both were hand-forged about 40 years ago. The knife was made from the outer race of a Tempkin roller bearing and the gouge was made from the outer race of a ball bearing.




Bill Moore made this chest of drawers to store his wife's art supplies. It is made from cherry with curly maple drawer fronts. The drawer boxes are made from hard maple. Secondary woods include oak and poplar. The cherry is stained with a custom color to match other furniture. Drawer slides are made from UHMW plastic strips. The finish is wipe-on poly.



Jay Stearns won a blue ribbon 5 years ago at the Texas State Fair for this layered bandsawn box.



Mike Blazier made this custom TV stand out of alder, veneer and plywood. He designed it using Sketchup to fit into a 90 degree alcove or corner. It is a deep cabinet flanked by two shallow cabinets, covered by a top shaped to fit into the corner. The doors on the center cabinet can be opened at an angle to project the sound across the room.
