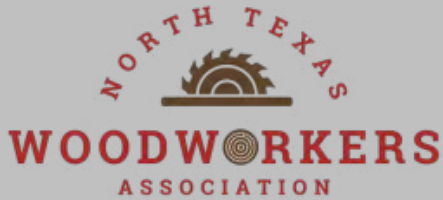

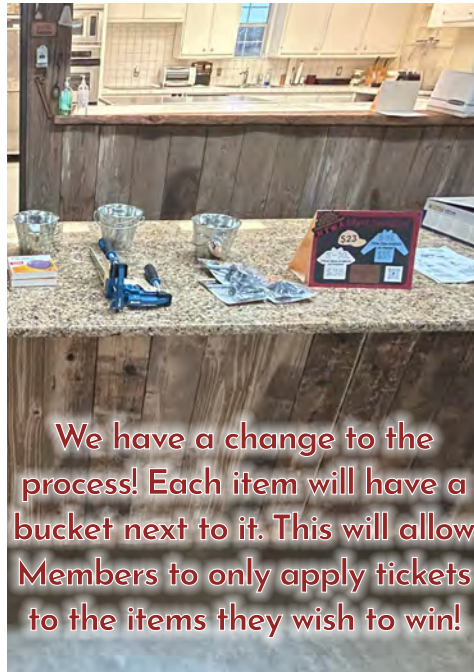

Ed Haluska used a Walnut slab gifted from another Member to make a few items! He made a comfort cross, 3 bud vases and a salad serving set.

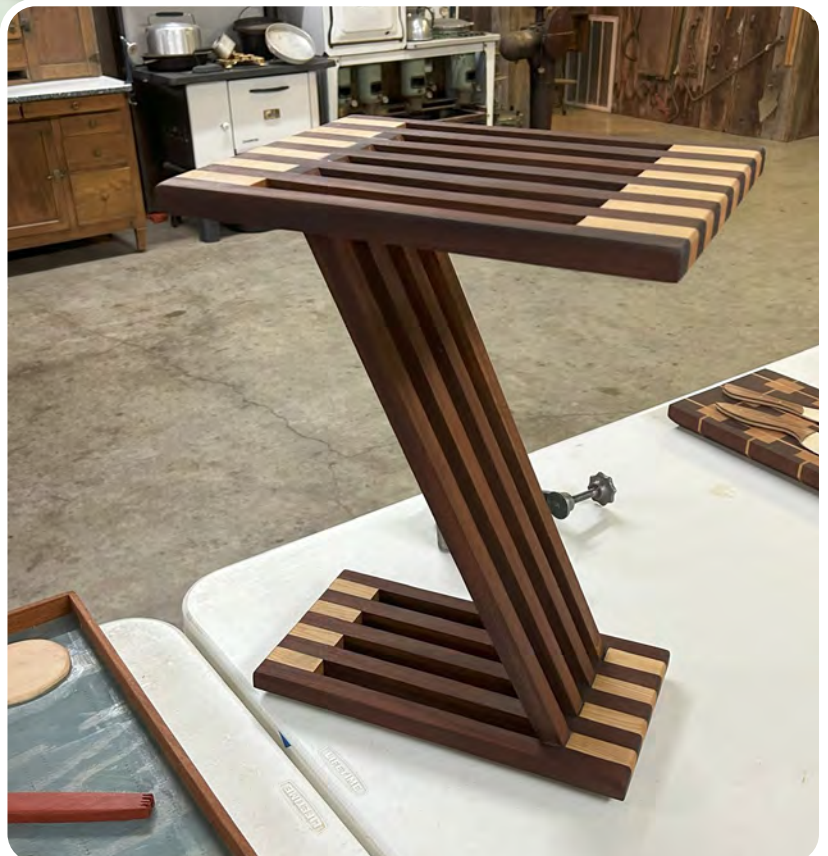

The platform should be self standing and will be painted in the specified color of white selected by the NTWA Show Committee. Any item(s) to be displayed on the wall should have two "D" rings on the back within the top 2" on either side.

Terms and Conditions

General Conditions: (1) The Eisemann Center will exercise reasonable care while handling and exhibiting your work but will not be responsible for loss or damage. (2) NTWA reserves the right to photograph entries to be used for promotion and publicity. (3) All accepted entries shall remain in position as placed by the Show Committee for the entire duration of the show. (4) In the unlikely event that an entry is deemed unsuitable after delivery, the NTWA Show Committee reserves the right to disallow it for exhibit. (5) The Eisemann Center requires a 15% sales commission if a piece is sold. (6) The Eisemann Center requires sales tax be collected on any piece sold.
