

Gary Vaughan was in Santa Fe and got petrified wood and made these book ends! He used Peruvian Rosewood and Petrified Wood.



Brian O'Donnell made Pizza Peels with scrap wood for Christmas gifts for Family.






Britt Baumel shared the Mallet he crafted out of Walnut and maple.






